Enrichment for a broad and well-rounded student experience



As well as your academic or vocational studies, our Sixth Form gives you space to further your potential and grow in confidence.

We encourage students to explore all that is available to them, developing their personal interests, skills and experiences, with personalised support from our Sixth Form team.

Since 2018, a number of Sixth Form students have been successful in winning the prestigious Pioneer Award from BASET (Britain-Australia Society Education Trust); most recently two of our students were able to travel to Darwin and Melbourne for four weeks to spend time at Haileybury Australia schools. Students have also travelled to Uganda, working with Haileybury Youth Trust which trains young Ugandans in innovative building technologies and construction skills that improves education and life chances. Both of these overseas partnerships provide students with the opportunity to develop independence and resilience and we expect to keep offering these in future years.

We regularly have speakers from universities to come to our Sixth Form to give students an understanding of the university experience. We also invite organisations, such as the Bank of England, to discuss what the bank does and how the economy works.

We attend University and Apprenticeship Fairs and run a Futures Week where we help to prepare our students for life after Haileybury Turnford and hear about the vast range of courses and training available. Students find these events

informative and inspiring as they begin to decide their next steps after Sixth Form.

Alongside the suite of A level and Level 3 vocational subjects, we participate in a wide range of enrichment programmes:

- **Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)** which is standalone qualification designed to extend and develop your skills in independent research and project management.
- **Core Maths** where you will develop your confidence in applying maths to solve real world questions and therefore enhance your problem-solving skills.
- **Personal Finance – Certificate in Financial Education** which provides an introduction to, and preparation for, further study through developing an understanding of the economy, financial management skills, employability, and enterprise.
- **Travel to Uganda** to see the work of Haileybury Youth Trust (an award-winning charity), who train young Ugandans etc.
- **Courses** and training opportunities available.
