Using calculators – the rules



Students may use a calculator in an exam unless the question paper says they are not allowed to.

Students are responsible for making sure that their calculators meet the regulations as detailed below:

Calculators must be:

- of a size suitable for use on the desk;
- either battery or solar powered;
- free of lids, cases and covers which have printed instructions or formulas.

Calculators must not:

- be designed or adapted to offer any of these facilities: -
 - language translators;
 - o symbolic algebra manipulation;
 - symbolic differentiation or integration;
 - o communication with other machines or the internet;
- be borrowed from another candidate during an examination for any reason;
- have retrievable information stored in them this includes:
 - o databanks;
 - dictionaries:
 - mathematical formulas;
 - o text.

The candidate is responsible for the following:

- the calculator's power supply;
- the calculator's working condition;
- clearing anything stored in the calculator.

Any breach of these instructions can constitute malpractice and the awarding body may decide to penalise a student, which could include disqualification.
