

Recipe of the Month – Hunter's Chicken

Our Food Technology Department are challenging our students to try a new recipe each month. This month it is **Hunter's Chicken**. Our GCSE students have been looking at teenage nutrition. This is one of the most popular dishes they chose. It is full of protein for their growth and repair and the fat soluble vitamins K,A,D and E.



Ingredients

1 tablespoon vegetable oil, plus extra for the tray 4 skinless chicken breasts 4 rashers smoked back bacon 1 red onion, sliced 1 pack runner beans, ends trimmed 3 carrots, peeled and sliced 100ml sticky BBQ sauce 25g grated cheddar

For the mash: 4 potatoes, peeled and chopped 100ml milk

Method

- Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Oil a tray, put the chicken breasts on it and cover each one with 1 bacon rasher. Put the chicken in the oven for 20-25 minutes until cooked through.
- While the chicken is cooking, fry the onion in 1 tablespoon oil until golden brown and soft, then set aside.
- Put the potatoes in a large pan of boiling water and cook for 10-15 minutes until soft.
- Put another smaller pan of water on the hob and bring to the boil while the potatoes are cooking.
- Once boiling, tip in the runner beans and carrots and cook for 8-10 minutes until soft but with a little bite.
- Drain the potatoes and put them back in the pan with the milk, mash until smooth and stir though the fried onions.
- Once the chicken is cooked, pour over the BBQ sauce and scatter over the cheddar and return to the oven for 2 minutes until the cheese has melted. Serve with the mash, carrots and runner beans.
