## Recipe of the Month - Sweet potato, chickpea & spinach curry

Our Food Technology Department are challenging our students to try a new recipe each month. This month it is **Chickpea Curry**. It is good to encourage children to cook from a young age so they learn lifelong skills to ensure they are choosing the right meals and snacks to provide them with the nutrients they need. Each newsletter we will be sharing a low cost recipe that is packed full of nutrients and easy to cook by your son or daughter. This recipe contains two of your five a day. It is high in protein which is good for teenagers' growth along with Vitamin B6 and fibre from the sweet potato. If served with rice it provides good slow release energy which would keep you full and reduce snacking. A quick easy recipe that teenagers can cook for the whole family and the best thing is you get a night off! Serves 6: **Total cost for 6 adult portions £5.29**

### Ingredients

- olive oil
- 2 red onions
- 3 tablespoons Rogan josh paste (or any curry paste you prefer)
- 1 fresh red chilli (optional)
- 1 bunch of fresh coriander(optional)
- 3 sweet potatoes
- 400 g tin chickpeas
- 400g tin chopped tomatoes
- 400 ml tin light coconut milk
- 400 g pre-washed spinach



### Method

1. Heat 2 tablespoons of oil in a large saucepan over a medium heat.
2. Peel, finely slice and add the onion along with the curry paste, mix well, then cook until the onion is soft and golden, stirring occasionally.
3. Finely chop the chilli (optional) Pick the coriander leaves and finely slice the stalks (optional). Chop the sweet potatoes into 2cm chunks.
4. Add the chilli, coriander stalks and sweet potato to the softened onion. Drain and tip in the chickpeas, then cook for 5 minutes.
5. Tip in the tinned tomatoes. Add 200ml of water and bring to the boil.
6. Reduce the heat to a simmer, then cover and cook for 10 to 15 minutes.
7. Remove the lid, then cook for a further 15 to 20 minutes, stirring occasionally, or until the sweet potato is cooked through and the sauce thickened.
8. Stir in the coconut milk and cook for a couple of minutes, then stir in the spinach and cook until wilted.
9. Scatter over the coriander leaves, then serve with poppadum's and rice, if you like.

## Haileybury Turnford Award – Year 7 & 8

Every time a student is awarded an achievement point in school they are working towards the achievement of the HT Award. The HT Award is our opportunity to recognise the diligence, effort and commitment to our school as well as to the students' own futures. The HT Award has 4 categories of success linked to the total achievement points received in lessons as well as contributions made towards our school and in our local community.



### How does the HT Award work?

#### The HT Award has 4 categories:

Bronze (achieved when 150 points are reached)

Silver (achieved when 350 points are reached)

Gold (achieved when 500 points are reached as well as 1 recognised service to the school e.g representing the school in a sports fixture for example)

HT Award (achieved when 750 points are reached as well as 2 recognised services to the school are completed and recognised by the Principal or Vice Principals)

Once a student has achieved the necessary criteria they will be awarded with their respective badges in their year group assembly.

#### Is it possible to achieve these point totals?

The HT Award is a recognition system that students will work towards over both Year 7 & 8. This means students will carry their achievement points over from Year 7 into Year 8. Every student has the ability to earn these achievement points over the two year period. Clearly the Gold and HT award require a special level of commitment to our school and local community.

#### How often are the award badges issued?

HT Badges will be issued every half-term when updated totals on achievement are calculated.

#### Do negative behaviour points count?

No – any students negative behaviour points will not impact on their receiving of the award. Only positive behaviour points are considered in the HT Award i.e. negative behaviour points do not reduce achievement points.
