## United Kingdom Mathematics Trust Challenges

During the Spring term over 250,000 students from more than 3,000 schools and colleges across the UK participated in the Intermediate Mathematical Challenge. Students had 60 minutes to answer 25 varied multiple-choice mathematical problems. High scorers were awarded certificates to recognise their success in mathematics, with top scorers invited to participate in the follow-on competitions and mentoring schemes.

Congratulations to the 10 students from Years 9, 10 & 11 who sat the intermediate challenge in February. 5 students won Bronze Awards - **Jack Pym** and **Joao Cabaco** in Year 10 and **Sam Marendez**, **Calvin Kanu** and **Maddie Warren** in Year 11.

They invited a speaker from Paradise Wildlife Park who came to Haileybury Turnford to talk to them about conservation and trade of illegal animal products. They especially enjoyed the hands on element of the session.



In addition to this project the Science Ambassadors have been busy being Citizen Scientists on a project with the Natural History Museum bird collection as well as several other activities. They have

- used chromatography to change gnome and dwarf hairstyles
- used jelly babies to make a wave machine – which they have since demonstrated in the year 7 science classes.
- used acids and carbonates to fire camera canisters up in the air
- watched **Artem Khamfriz** use a UV light to illuminate tonic water
- raced to make two DNA models.
