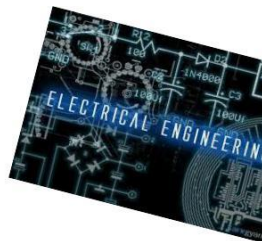
Did you know: The National Health Service is the world's sixth-largest employer by number of employees (1.7 million). They have over 350 different roles to choose from, and not all of them are medical.

The course will feature a blend of theoretical study of veterinary science and animal anatomy, along with practical workshops, which allow you to build a base level of relevant veterinary science knowledge. These enjoyable but informative workshops introduce you to the kind of tasks you might learn as a future veterinary student, as well as giving you a flavour of the jobs you might one day do if you pursue a career in veterinary medicine. You will also spend some time considering issues of ethics and animal welfare in veterinary practice.

students thinking of making an application to study in the UK.

The course will feature a blend of theoretical study of veterinary science and animal anatomy, along with practical workshops, which teach you how to perform basic vet procedures. These enjoyable but informative workshops introduce you to the kind of tasks you'll learn as a veterinary student, as well as giving you a flavour of the jobs you would one day do if you pursue a career in veterinary medicine.
