Assessment: 'Suffering is given to a person for a reason'	<b>Charity and Kindness</b> R.S: Religious charities e.g. Christian Aid PSHE/citizenship: empathy, kindness, communities locally and globally, inspirational people. Assessment: 'We should always help others no matter what'	<b>Puberty and Relationships</b> R.S: Attitudes to sex outside of marriage/importance of marriage PSHE/citizenship: sex education, puberty, body changes, body variation Assessment: 'Sex outside of marriage is wrong'
<b>9</b>	<b>Internet Safety</b> R.S: Promoting kindness and equality PSHE/citizenship: Internet safety, internet and the law, friendships, cyberbullying, trolling, responsibility. Assessment: 'More should be done to make the internet safe'	<b>Sex Education</b> R.S: Attitudes to contraception and sex outside of marriage PSHE/citizenship: contraception, safe sex, STD's, pregnancy, informed decision making Assessment: 'It is vital that students receive sex education in schools'	<b>Healthy Relationships</b> R.S: Attitudes to relationships and sex outside of marriage PSHE/citizenship: consent, positive qualities, assertiveness, domestic violence, signs of abuse, healthy relationships Assessment: 'It is important to feel safe and secure in a relationship'
<b>10</b>	<b>Drugs, Alcohol and Mental Health</b> R.S: Attitudes to the body and drugs PSHE/citizenship: drugs, alcohol, mental health issues, informed decision making, drugs and the law, drugs and the impact on the UK and the individual Assessment: 'Cannabis should be legalised'	<b>Sex Education</b> R.S: Attitudes to abortion PSHE/citizenship: Sex and the internet, assertiveness, risky behaviours, AIDS/HIV, unwanted pregnancies, impact on the UK and economy, peer pressure Assessment: 'Abortion is a personal decision'	<b>UK Law</b> R.S: Attitudes to crime and punishment PSHE/citizenship: UK and the law, rights and responsibility, decision making, changes in the law Assessment: 'Capital punishment should be brought back to the UK'
<b>11</b>	<b>Living in the UK</b> R.S: Influence of religion in the UK PSHE: Multi-faith communities, budgeting skills, British economy, Parliament, voting, life choices, rights and responsibilities, welfare system,	<b>Careers</b> R.S: Voluntary work/Charities PSHE: aspirations, goal setting, personal identity, strengths and weaknesses, careers, role models.
