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Attendance

Each student should aim for 100% attendance, we need your support!

100% Attendance	0 weeks of missed learning
95% Attendance	1 week and 4 days of missed learning
90% Attendance	3 weeks and 4 days of missed learning
85% Attendance	5 weeks and 3 days of missed learning
80% Attendance	7 weeks and 3 days of missed learning
70% Attendance	9 weeks and 1 days of missed learning



Attendance

- Any student with **90% attendance** is classed as **persistently absent from school**
- Haileybury Turnford will continue to work with the **Attendance Improvement Officer from Hertfordshire County Attendance Team** who will have the responsibility to enforce school attendance and will issue penalty notices including court action where necessary



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Supporting your child

- Literacy and numeracy at home – 30 minutes minimum
 - When was the last time you read with your child?
- Looking at work set on Class Charts and in their planners
- Emphasise the importance of good attendance
- Contacting the school (tutor in the first instance) if you have a concern
- Uniform expectations and equipment

Progress and Achievement Year 8

- No longer using target grades at KS3
- Instead we are tracking against a standard
- So what is the standard?
- How is the standard set?
- How will this be reported to parents?



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Progress and Achievement Year 8

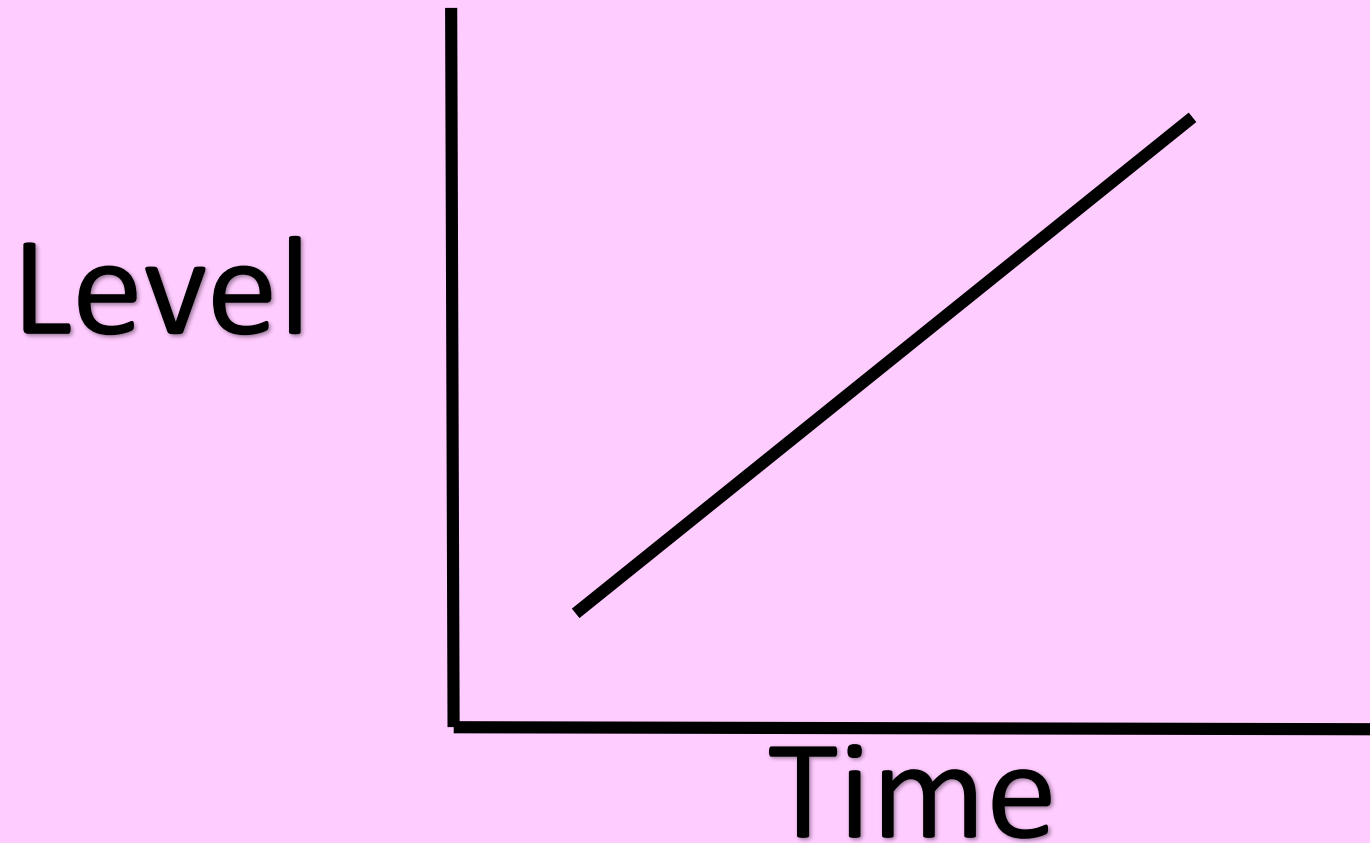
- Target grades removed
- Set the “expected standard”
 - E.g. “Students in Year 8 Maths will be able to multiply using 9x table”
- Measure against the standard (assess)
 - “Student has met the standard”
 - “Student is working towards the standard”
 - “Student exceeds the standard”
 - “Student is below the standard”
- How does this help?
 - Conversations about what they can / can’t do – HOW TO IMPROVE



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What does “meeting the standard” mean in Year 8?



Reports / Progress Updates

- All students will be assessed against GCSE standards
- Year 8 will receive Progress Updates once per term including Attitude to Learning grades
- Attendance will be reported



Curriculum support

- Year 8 will choose their GCSE options at the end of Year 8
- Year 8 Options Evening will allow students and parents/carers to discuss subjects with members of staff



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Curriculum – Year 8

- 8 hours per fortnight of Maths
- 8 hours per fortnight of English
- 7 hours of science
- 3 hours of Geography & History
- 2 hours of PSD
- 4 hours of Spanish & PE – Extra Literacy Support
- 1 hour of Food & Dance & Computing
- 2 hours of Drama, Art, Music, DT, Food Tec
