<u>Curriculum</u>

- 8 hours per fortnight of Maths & Science
- 9 hours per fortnight of English
- Option blocks
 - ✓4 subjects
 - ✓ 5 hours a fortnight
- 3 hours of Physical Education
- 1 hour of Personal & Social Development
- 1 hour of Religious Studies



Preparing for GCSEs

- Year 9s will be skills building in their subjects until January 2020 - this will allow students to move subjects if necessary within the first term
- From January 2020 onwards the GCSE/BTEC curriculum will commence
- Students will be assessed against the GCSE/BTEC grade criteria

- Individual targets for each subject
- Challenging but achievable



<u>Reports / Progress Updates</u>

- All students will be assessed against GCSE/BTEC grades
- Year 9 will receive Progress Updates once per term including Attitude to Learning grades
- Attendance will be reported



<u>Attendance</u>

Each student should aim for 100% attendance, we need your support!

100% Attendance	0 weeks of missed learning	Best chance of success
95% Attendance	1 week and 4 days of missed learning	Well Done!
90% Attendance	3 weeks and 4 days of missed learning	Poor Attendance Worrying!
85% Attendance	5 weeks and 3 days of missed learning	
80% Attendance	7 weeks and 3 days of missed learning	
70% Attendance	9 weeks and 1 days of missed learning	Very Poor Attendance Very Concerning!



<u>Attendance</u>

- Any student with 90% attendance is classed as persistently absent from school
- Haileybury Turnford will continue to work with Attendance Improvement Officer from Hertfordshire County Attendance Team who will have the responsibility to enforce school attendance and will issue penalty notices including court action where necessary



Supporting your child

- Discuss their end of year target grade and Progress Updates
- Looking at work set on Class Charts and in their planners
- Encourage your child to do personal study, independent learning and reading at home
- Emphasise the importance of good attendance
- Contacting the school (tutor in the first instance) if you have a concern






