Technology

Within the year 10 Design and Technology options of GCSE Design & Technology, L2 Engineering and GCSE Food and Nutrition all tasks are project led and students are assessed at the end of each project/topic. The focus of the assessments are based on the specific products, materials, ingredients and processes that students have been exploring and working with. The timing of assessments will vary depending on the rate at which groups move through the planning / development stages of the project and the duration of the practical activities. To ensure that assessments are relevant and that students are well prepared, we will only carry out assessments once groups have reached the final stages of their current project/topic.
