# The Haileybury Turnford House System

The Haileybury Turnford House system is made up of six houses; Bevan, Pankhurst, Shackleton, Turing, Austen and Bader. Each form group, including the form tutor, will all belong to the same House to encourage a team ethos within the form and allow everyone to work together.

We encourage all students to participate in House competitions throughout the academic year. These will be run by individual faculties/departments or year teams. All academic achievements, achievement points and attendance will also feed into the House system. Each form will nominate House captains to lead competitions within their form group.



Aneurin Bevan was a Welsh Labour Party politician who was the Minister for Health in the UK from 1945 to 1951. Bevan was a lifelong champion of social justice, the rights of working people and democratic socialism.



Emmeline Pankhurst was a British political activist and organizer of the British suffragette movement who helped women win the right to vote.



Sir Ernest Henry Shackleton CVO OBE FRGS was a British polar explorer who led three British expeditions to the Antarctic. He was one of the principal figures of the period known as the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration.

Alan Mathison Turing OBE FRS was a British mathematician, computer scientist, logician, cryptanalyst, philosopher and theoretical biologist.



Jane Austen was an English novelist known primarily for her six major novels, which interpret, critique and comment upon the British landed gentry at the end of the 18th century.



Lilian Bader was one of the first black women to join the British armed forces. During the Second World War she volunteered to join the WAAF and train as an Instrument Repairer. She passed her course 'First Class', becoming one of the first women in the air force to qualify in that trade.





# FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions)

I have been the Year Achievement Co-ordinator for Year 7 for 4 years at Haileybury Turnford. Below are some of the questions I get asked the most by Year 6s with my answers!

**Are we allowed mobile phones?** Students are not allowed to use mobile phones in school, including at break and lunch times, if a member of staff sees your mobile phone it will be confiscated.



**What happens if I get lost?** Secondary school is often bigger than primary school so this is something that Year 6s are often worried about! You may get lost in your first couple of weeks but it is nothing to worry about! You can ask any student or member of staff where you need to go or you can use the map in your planner to help you find your way.

**What happens if I am late to school?** It is really important to be organised in the morning to make sure that you get to school on time and make sure you set your alarm the night before. It is a good idea to work out your journey to school and how long it will take you before your first day so you make sure that you can arrive on time. We run paybacks at breaktime for students who are late to school so you really don't want to be late!



**Can we wear trainers?** No. Shoes, not trainers, are part of the school uniform. The only time you should be wearing trainers in school is for your PE lessons.

**What do we do for lunch?** You can either bring in your own lunch or buy it from the school canteen. If you are buying lunch in school then we use our fingerprints to pay for lunch. This is linked to your account which can be topped up with money by either logging onto your account at home or putting money onto your account using a machine in school. If you are bringing money into school then we suggest that you put this onto your account first thing in the morning so you don't have a chance to lose it!



**Will we have lockers?** Lockers will be available for Year 7 students, a letter with details on how to get a locker will be sent out by Miss Nethercott at a later date.
