As a priority, students should complete the work set by our teachers, but some of these resources might be of interest to families to supplement our HT curriculum. We would value any feedback should families access any of these resources.

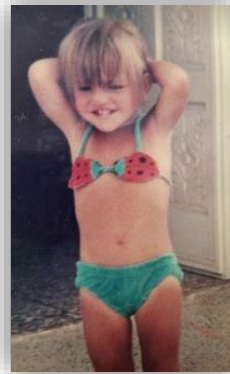

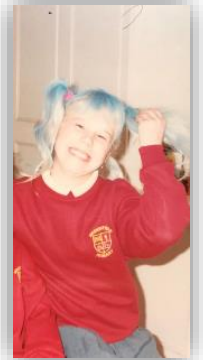

 - ¡Estupendo! (great!)
 - ¡Trabajo excelente! (excellent work!)
