A glacier is a persistent body of dense ice that is constantly moving under its own weight.	A glacier forms where the accumulation of snow exceeds its ablation over many years, often centuries.	To cover or become covered with glaciers or masses of ice.

A glacier's weight, combined with its gradual movement, can drastically reshape the landscape over hundreds or even thousands of years.	Glaciated valley landscapes are typically dominated by erosional features such as cirques and U-shaped valleys, whilst landscapes affected by ice sheets commonly include features such as extensive drumlin fields and outwash plains.
