Taster Academic Seminar: Creative Writing

University event offered by St Mary's University, Twickenham. Getting writing ideas - 'Polaroid Moments'. This session is suitable for year 12 and 13 students considering studying Creative Writing at university level. This session introduces students to ways of generating ideas for their writing by considering remarkable moments from their life - not necessarily dramatic or traumatic moments, by oddly memorable ones. Discussion includes ways that writers and novelists mine their and other people's lives for material, the ethics of writing about your own or other people's lives, and ways to develop ideas so that they divert from what 'really' happened.

Meet the Russell Group is designed to support Year 13, 12 and 11 students, and is completely free of charge to students, parents and teachers. Taking place just before the October 2020 deadline for Oxford and Cambridge, medicine, dentistry and veterinary science courses, it will provide vital application support to Year 13s. The event will also support Year 13s working towards the January 2021 application deadline, and Year 12s seeking inspiration and information for their university applications next year. Year 11 students are welcome to join if they are interested in exploring their future options too.

Meet the Russell Group will be hosting 12 live webinars throughout the day on Wednesday 7 October, with university representatives and student ambassadors from the Russell Group universities talking you through a range of topics and answering your questions. They recommend catching the topics you're interested in live so you can take part in the Q&A chat; but you can easily catch-up on any sessions in the Auditorium after they've aired too.

The HE digital information evening is designed to make sure that all students, parents and carers interested in progressing onto Higher Education courses are fully informed of all of the options available to them and the process involved.

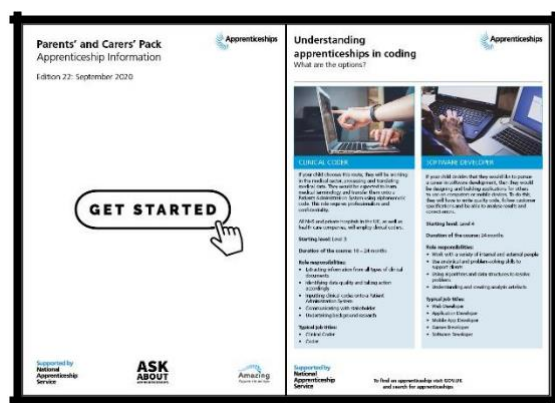
