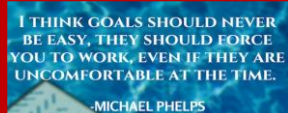


A message from Mr Barrett

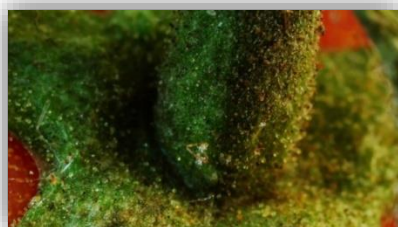
