- Application and information – forms due back by **Monday 14th December (last week of term)**
- Progress meetings - February/March
- June – Final letter of offer sent to you
- July Induction - two days - before summer break
- 27th August – GCSE Results day
- September – Progression in the Sixth Form is confirmed following results



Admissions Criteria

- Depends on your chosen subject
- Level 5 grade entry requirement for most A Levels subjects
- BTECs/CTECs – 5 GCSEs at grade 4
