#### Hertfordshire Opportunities Portal (HOP) conduct a series of webinars each week that feature interviews with local employers.

Our next Virtual Encounter will take place on Thursday 10th Dec 3:30pm and the theme will be Careers in the Motor Trade Industry. The Motor Trade is about far more than mechanics and second hand car salesmen (although it will still require these roles in the future too!) This webinar explores the different careers opportunities in the industry with a particular focus on some of the Automotive Technology and Engineering posts that will be required in light of changing technology.

**Gavin White** is the CEO of Autotech Group. Having studied Business Studies at College, at the age of 19 he had a brief few years as a water cooler service technician, before taking on his first junior sales role in the fork truck industry. After taking voluntary redundancy, he travelled the world for around 2 years, before finding his next role selling advertising for a wellknown Motoring Magazine. This then led to a very successful career in the Motor Trade, with a brief 2 year gap in the recruitment industry serving the Energy & Utilities sector. This gave him the inspiration to start Autotech Recruit Ltd in 2010, which now employees 30 direct heads at the companies HQ in Milton Keynes and around 450 contractors across the UK. With a vision to improve access to young talent and skills for the motor trade, Gavin is now embarking on two new ventures Autotech Training and Autotech Academy to help grow Autotech Group and support the automotive industry well in to the future.

**Dominic Flint** – Technical Trainer Skillnet – Started as a Light Vehicle Apprentice, working in the industry until moving to train our technicians of the future.

**Gemma Edwards** is Careers Coordinator for Institute of Motor Industry which is located in Brickenden, near Hertford. Gemma has oversight for the skills needs across the industry; she has previously worked in recruitment.

This webinar is predominantly designed for students in Years 10 – 13. #### **UCAS Confirmation and changes to key dates**

UCAS can now confirm the following key dates following a review with the secondary education and higher education sectors. These revised dates are to provide further support to applicants applying to university in 2021.

- 15 January 2021: this equal consideration date remains the same.
- Extra opens on 11 February: students who are eligible to use Extra can add another choice (originally 25 February).
- University and college decisions: for students who applied by 15 January, the decisions deadline for providers will be by 20 May (originally 6 May)
- Student replies: students who receive all their decisions by 3 June, will have until 10 June to reply (was 17 June).
