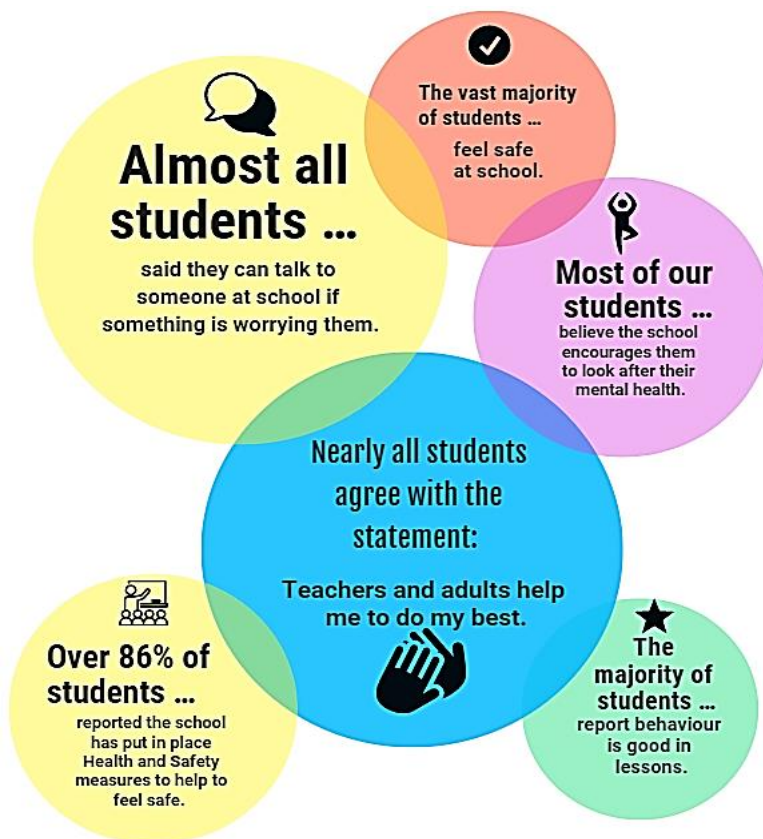

Dear Parent/Carer

Last term we have carried out a whole school survey. This survey was offered to all students in Year 7-13 and over 90% of all students completed the survey. We asked students a number of questions about their views on personal development, behaviour, and teaching and learning across the school. We also asked students to give their suggestions on how we can continue to create a positive and inclusive culture for all students within our school.

Through gaining students' views and opinions we want to provide opportunities for discussion on important issues and for students to feel that they can engage and influence developments in our school. Below is a snapshot of some of the student responses to the survey questions asked:

We would like better toilet facilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• New soap dispensers have been fitted in all student toilets where required. The toilets are cleaned on a regular basis throughout the day and minor repair work has been completed.• There will be further upgrades to some existing toilet facilities this academic year.• New toilet facilities for students will be provided in our new building from September 2021.

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Have more opportunities to talk about mental health and wellbeing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Frequent opportunities for Community and Personal Development are organised for all students with a focus on wellbeing – both face-to-face and remotely during this current period of national restrictions.• A half-termly Mental Health and Wellbeing Newsletter is published for all students.• Student rewards and achievements will focus on developing our HT character traits.
(Y7 and Y8 students) lunchtime is too short	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Year 7 and Year 8 organised extended lunchtime as a reward for students towards the end of the autumn term.
More seating areas	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Outside seating has been increased in each Year group social and outdoor space. We will continue to review this.
Offer more opportunities to talk about cultures, different religions and daily affairs	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Personal & Social Development (PSD) curriculum has been reviewed to include more content around daily affairs, religion and different cultures. There is a dedicated PSD Tutorial period for Y7-11 in addition to the PSD timetabled curriculum.
We would like more opportunities to be rewarded at school	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We have introduced a HT Reward System across the school. Students can achieve subject certificates every half-term.• We will be introducing a HT Certificate and Award for students who can demonstrate one of the HT character traits, each half-term. We encourage our staff to make positive phone calls home and every student has an opportunity to be nominated to sign the Principal's Book.• There will be Lockdown Learning Awards during this period of national restrictions whilst students are working remotely.

We intend to carry out regular student surveys and will work with our Student Leaders we continue to create a school culture where all students are valued and supported to achieve the very best they are capable of.
