"What has been achieved by our students is quite remarkable", commented Robin Newman, Principal. Students have been accessing lessons following their normal timetable, using their IT devices, and our staff have continued to show real care and commitment to ensure learning continues effectively during this period.

"Students who did not have their own IT devices during last year's lockdown have been provided with devices to support their learning, and very strong attendance at lessons. In addition to devices provided by the government, we raised over £5,000 from our community fundraising campaign for IT devices, making a real difference to many HT students", commented Robin Newman, Principal.
