A few words from Mr Newman

School fully open with happy students!

It has been wonderful to have our students back at school. I could not be more proud of how our entire community has worked together to support our young people. In addition to re-establishing learning routines, nearly all students have been tested three times over the past two weeks. Thank you to our parent volunteers who helped with this huge logistical challenge. Home testing for students, twice weekly, is now underway; and staff are also testing twice weekly from home. Lessons have been very focused, and it has been excellent to see students working with their teachers back at school, including in a wide range of practical subjects.

Students have adapted to wearing face masks in class since we welcomed all students back to school last week – the government has stated that they will review the wearing of face masks in class at Easter, and we will provide updates in due course.

We also had a visit from the Borough of Broxbourne this week, as part of their visits to all schools, to review COVID-19 protective measures. I can report that they deemed all protective measures to be fully in place, giving external assurance about the school's COVID-19 risk management plan.

During the recent lockdown, we have continued to develop our facilities for students, and this week, have opened our refurbished toilets, which are initially for Year 11 students to use. We also have two brand new water bottle filling stations in the Dining Hall. Please ensure your child brings a water bottle to school.

Since Christmas, our new building project has made great progress, and we remain on schedule to open this new building to students at the start of term in September. Pictures of our new building can be seen inside HT News.

Finally, I would like to thank all families once again for your support since Christmas, and during the past 12 months – you have done such a brilliant job at home supporting your children, in very difficult circumstances. We are determined to do all we can to get as many co-curricular activities and other school events back up and running as soon as we can.

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HT voted as best breakfast club in the East of England

The Kellogg's panel of judges selected winners based on the inspiring individuals and activities that transform the mornings of children across the UK. HT has been crowned the best club in the East of England in the annual Kellogg's Breakfast Club Awards. Voted by a panel of judges as the best breakfast club in the East of England and has received a cash prize of £1,000 to spend on its breakfast club, as well as a special party pack for the children to celebrate in the coming months.



The Kellogg's panel of judges selected winners based on the inspiring individuals and activities that transform the mornings of children across the UK and with so many amazing stories submitted, the competition was tough.

Haileybury Turnford's commitment to ensure every child has breakfast to start their day and their ability to adapt to regulations during the pandemic impressed the panel. During the first national lockdown, the breakfast club stayed open to provide for vulnerable students. Haileybury Turnford ensured school counsellors were on hand each day to meet the needs of students and purchased extra food on top of the government voucher scheme to deliver to family's homes.

Haileybury Turnford's principal, Robin Newman, said: "Haileybury Turnford is delighted to be awarded the best breakfast club in the East of England. "It provides such important provision for our students – it provides an opportunity to connect them to their school community at the start of the day and sets them up for their day's learning ahead of them. We are thrilled."

To adapt to regulations, the club has provided each of their year group zones with a Kellogg's Breakfast Bag. The Breakfast Bag allows students to help themselves to food in the morning and return at any point in the day. This has been vital to ensure children have the support they need.

Haileybury Turnford will spend its winnings on keeping their Kellogg's Breakfast Bag initiative going in 2021.

Chris Silcock, VP and chief of Kellogg's UK and Ireland, said: "I have had the opportunity to see the amazing work breakfast clubs do first hand. The pandemic has proven that now, more than ever, breakfast clubs are vital for so many families. Demetria Devonne Lovato (Born August 20th 1992) is an American singer/songwriter who started off as a Disney channel star in 2007 when she was only 15. Who has gone on to be nominated for 213 awards winning a total of 61 in her career which includes 14 teen choice awards, 5 people's choice awards, 4 ASCAP pop music awards and many more.

She also made history when she became the youngest x factor judge in 2014 winning herself a Guinness world record. Although it wasn't until her 2017 YouTube documentary 'Simply Complicated' that the singer directly acknowledged that she was open to dating men and women, explaining that she was very fluid. This was quickly followed with the link in her song 'Cool for the summer' which includes lyrics such as "Got a taste for the cherry / I just need to take a bite." Which is a reference to the song 'I kissed a girl' by Katy Perry

Demi Lovato was diagnosed as Bipolar in 2011 and ever since has been very open about her struggle with mental health in her career mentioning that she has dealt with "suicidal thoughts and depression" but in spite of this demi describes herself as "living proof that you never have to give in to those thoughts."

Demi is a very inspiring young woman who continues to help young people with her music and work in film/Tv.

Wilson told *Guardian Review* in an interview published on Saturday that she had put her "heart and soul" into the story, and said she knew "perfectly well that it would shine a little light on my own private life"

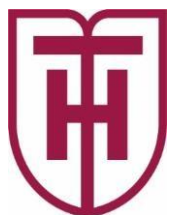
