#### Purpose and Background

Haileybury Turnford has a Home-School Agreement, which is a statement explaining:

- The school's vision and values
- The school's responsibilities towards its students
- The responsibility of each student's parents/carers
- What the school expects of its students.

This Home-School Agreement takes account of all relevant legislation.

## **Policy objectives**

This Home-School Agreement aims to establish a partnership between Haileybury Turnford, parents/carers and students, in accordance with the school ethos, vision and values. We want to work with parents/carers to support our students during their time at school so that together we can ensure they fulfil their academic aspirations and develop good character. This Home-School Agreement does not include any terms or conditions which could be considered unlawful or unreasonable, such as requiring parents to make a financial contribution to the school, or refusing to waive any requirement on school uniform in cases where the parent and child cannot comply for religious reasons. This agreement encapsulates our belief that parents are a student's first and foremost important educators. The agreement is designed to help our students achieve the highest possible standards through close and effective communication with parents.

#### **Practice and procedures**

Haileybury Turnford will take reasonable steps to ensure:

- All registered parents of students return the parental declaration electronically to indicate that they understand and accept the contents of the Home-School Agreement.
- All parents/carers both within and outside the child's home are given the opportunity to
  indicate that they understand and accept the contents of the Home-School Agreement and
  review the content of the agreement regularly during the time their child is at school.

## Haileybury Turnford will not:

- Seek the signature of a parent where they consider that there are special circumstances relating to the parent or student in question that would make it inappropriate to do so
- Invite a parent or child to sign the parental declaration before the child has been admitted to the school
- Make the signing of the parental declaration a condition of the child's admission to the school
- Base a decision about admitting a child to the school on assumptions about whether his or her parents are or are not likely to sign the parental declaration.

Haileybury Turnford will also invite all students to sign the agreement as an indication that they acknowledge and accept the school's expectations.



## HAILEYBURY TURNFORD HOME-SCHOOL AGREEMENT

The aim of this Home-School Agreement is to establish a partnership between Haileybury Turnford, parents/carers and students so that we can work together to ensure students fulfil their academic aspirations and develop good character in accordance with the school's ethos, vision and values.

#### Agreement for the Parent or Carer

I will make sure my child is ready for school by:

- Ensuring my child attends school regularly and at the required time and is wearing the correct school uniform.
- Support the school policies including the Rewards, Behaviour and Discipline Policy.
- Request time off in advance for my child if he/she needs to be absent from school.
- Inform the school by text, email or telephone on the first day of absence giving the reason for my child's absence.
- Making certain my child has a school bag including the following correct equipment (2 pens, a pencil, a ruler, a rubber, a sharpener, all maths equipment including a calculator, and a refillable water bottle and PE kit.
- Make certain my child brings a suitable reading book to school each day.
- Attend meetings with relevant members of staff to support my child.
- Encourage positive attitudes towards school, learning and homework.
- Keep up to date with information about how you can support your child, including using the Class Charts App.
- Support my child with completing set homework and promote additional reading at home.
- Talk to my child about the internet sites they use and report any concerns using the Child Exploitation Online Protection (CEOP) button on the HT website.
- Make early contact with the school on any matters affecting my child's progress, welfare or behaviour, including any medical conditions.
- Ensure that if my child rides a bicycle to school, he/she rides it safely, it is well
  maintained and that my child wears a cycle helmet.
- Keep the school informed about changes to my contact details.

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## **Agreement for Students**

- I will make sure I am on time to school each day and will be ready to learn in correct school uniform and have the correct equipment.
- Work to the best of my ability and be proud of my achievements.
- On the way to and from school I will not do anything to bring the school into disrepute and will be considerate and polite to members of the community.
- I will make sure I am polite, considerate and respectful to all staff, visitors and other students within the school.
- I will follow staff instructions at all times. I will follow all of the rules, guidance and expectations about health and safety.
- When in lessons I will be ready to learn, engage in all activities and try my best.
- I will not disrupt the lessons and if I do not understand an instruction or information, I will ask a teacher.
- Behave responsibly and appropriately when using social networking sites, the internet and websites, reporting any concerns via the CEOP button.
- Pay attention to road safety on my way to and from school, ensuring that if I ride a
  bicycle to school, I ride it safely and wear a cycle helmet.
- Ensure my mobile phone and other electronic devices are switched off and out of sight.
- I will look after the school environment and keep it litter free.
