Morgan Sindall Careers Visit Thursday 27th May

MORGAN SINDALL

HT had a visit from four colleagues who are all directly involved in our new building. Our students had mini presentations and Q&A with four different employers of Morgan Sindall; Site Manager, Quantity Surveyor, Architect and Design Architect.



HT students gained an insight into the day to day of each job role, how they got into the industry (as well as other pathways), what skills are necessary and best and worst parts of the job. We are hugely to Morgan Sindall for giving us this expert time with our students and I pass my thanks onto Mr Hill (*Faculty Lead – Technology*) for setting this up for our students.

*"The presentation gave us an interesting insight to the construction industry. We learnt that the construction and architecture business is more complex and diverse than we previously thought. It **isn't just laying bricks** and planning infrastructure; it's about **taking multiple factors into consideration**, ranging from the materials used, the sustainability of the materials, and the time taken to deliver the building. As a result, we learnt that there are **many types of jobs within this industry**, all requiring their **own set of special skills**, none of which I had any idea about. It was very interesting to learn about the different career pathways each of the professionals took to get where they are at today."* (Y12 student)



*"I learnt **how important communication is** and **how many different teams that specialise in different areas need to work together for every part of the project**. I am glad that I have had the opportunity to meet these key members and gain a better understanding of what they each do within a project."* (Y12 student)
