Congratulations to Miss Jethmalani who received the Pearson National Teaching Silver Award as schools across the country celebrate Thank a Teacher Day to highlight families' gratitude to school staff.



Selected from thousands of nominations, Miss Jethmalani has been honoured as one of 102 Pearson National Teaching Silver Award winners across the country. Miss Jethmalani was honoured with a Silver Award in The Award for Outstanding New Teacher of the Year for their outstanding commitment to changing the lives of the children they work with every day.

Miss Jethmalani has made an extraordinary impact as a newly qualified Teacher, taking every challenge in her stride and making a big impact on learners, colleagues, and the wider school community. She devotes a huge amount of time to improving her practice, consistently checking student progress to ensure they are benefitting and always adapting her teaching to suit the class.

Miss Jethmalani has now been shortlisted to win one of just 15 Gold Awards later in the year, in a programme which will be broadcast on the BBC. This is a great opportunity to celebrate the exceptional school staff who have worked wonders during an incredibly challenging time for educators across the country.

The Silver Award winners are being honoured as part of the wider celebrations for 'Thank a Teacher Day' this week, a national campaign to honour and recognise school staff for their incredible work. The celebrations follow new data which shows how the previous year's lockdowns have significantly changed how families across the country view the role of teachers. 

Target Oxbridge & Trinity College Cambridge Year 10 Programme

TARGET OXBRIDGE

We are happy to announce that we have launched a new programme for Year 10 students in partnership with Target Oxbridge. Target Oxbridge is a programme that aims to help Black African and Caribbean students and students of mixed race with Black African and Caribbean heritage increase their chances of getting into the Universities of Oxford or Cambridge (known collectively as Oxbridge). Since launching in 2012, Target Oxbridge has helped over 200 students to secure Oxbridge offers.

Students have been invited to attend four monthly webinars between April and July. These webinars will provide the chance to hear from current Black students at Cambridge and to ask questions about their experiences. The team at Trinity College, Cambridge will also provide information on what admissions tutors are looking for in applicants, and how students can make the right A Level choices to improve their chances of securing a place on their preferred Cambridge courses. The webinars will also provide advice and insights into how degree subject choice impacts career options, as well as the chance to take part in a mini lecture run by an academic.

Mental Health Awareness Week 2021

Emma Levinson, founder of Cake Before Therapy and Integrative Therapist has answered your questions ...

1. How do you cope when your brain tells you that people are only praising you just to humour you and you are not actually talented?

In this case I would say to look for the evidence. Who is telling you, you are talented? What would they gain from praising you if they didn't mean it? What evidence is there that they are not telling the truth? Finally, don't take feedback from someone you wouldn't go to for advice, listen to those you trust (teachers, parents etc).

2. How do I help someone?

It may sound simple but let them know you are there whenever they want to talk, or hang out. You could say that you have noticed they are acting differently so you wondered if everything was ok. Don't pressure them to talk if they are not ready, but if they know you are there they can come to you when they are. The important thing is to let the person know they are not alone and you are there for them.

3. What should I do if I want help but am too scared to ask?

- When you're feeling down, don't struggle on your own. There is lots of help and support available you just have to reach out to get it, but it can be scary.
- Decide who the best person and who you would feel most comfortable talking to? Many of us prefer talking to family or friends, but you may prefer to talk to professionals (these include teachers, helplines, online discussion forums or a GP or therapist).
- Pick a time and place. Choose a time and somewhere you feel comfortable, so you can talk uninterrupted.
- Decide what outcome you want? Do you just want to be listened to? Would you like more practical or emotional support? It's okay if you don't know, but it helps to think about what you would like to achieve.
- It can be helpful to make notes so you remember to include them in your conversation. Or you could let the other person read your notes if talking is difficult.
- Explain how you feel and what support you would like. They will have a better idea of how to try and help you.

4. What are the best things to do for wellbeing/to make me feel good?

- Getting a good night's sleep
- Keep a healthy and balanced diet
- Spend time outside (sunlight is proven to help with mood and wellbeing)
- Find a hobby or activity that gives you joy and you can relax doing.
- Exercise daily even if it's just a 10-minute walk
- Spend time with other people
- Live in the present don't spend time dwelling on the past or worrying about the future
- Most importantly laugh and enjoy yourself, try not to take everything too seriously!
