<u>Tasks</u>:

- 1. Choose a theorist from the list above.
- 2. Research: who are they, why are they known in the education world, what are their approaches to children's development and learning styles?
- 3. Print out your information and put it in your folder, under divider titled UNIT 1

3. Work placement

You will have to complete 50 hours placement over the 2-year course. It will be best if you enjoy this and go to places that you have an interest in!

<u>Tasks</u>:

- 1. Research local nurseries, pre-schools and primary schools with school nursery classes.
- 2. Write yourself a list of possibilities that you could get to and like the sound of.
- 3. Prepare a draft email or letter to send. Explain that you are a student at Haileybury Turnford completing the BTEC in Children's Play, Learning and Development and you need to complete placement hours with children aged 0-7 years and 11 months. (once you know your timetable you might have a morning or afternoon a week you could do or your work experience week at the end of year 12)
