

## Haileybury Turnford Careers Education and Guidance for Students in Year 7-13

### Haileybury Turnford Provider Access Statement Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education of training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligation under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 – Pupil entitlement. All students in Years 7-13 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualification and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

### Opportunities for Access

A number of events, integrated into the school careers programme, will offer providers an opportunity to come into school to speak to students and/or their parents/carers.

All year groups have Careers Education, Information & Guidance (CEIAG) in Personal & Social Development (PSD) lessons across the year and in weekly careers form times. Careers is also covered in all subjects within the curriculum.

### **Premises and Facilities**
