On Friday we were lucky enough to have an ex-student return to Haileybury Turnford to give a talk to our Y11, 12 & 13 Media students about her career progression so far into the entertainment industry.

Maisy left HT in 2020, the summer that we all went into the first lock down. Following just one day's work experience in a costume fitting department she enlisted in a runner's agency (Call Time) and within her first year she has worked on feature films and television such as:

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#### Jon Datta returned to inspire and breakdown barriers for those who wish to apply for Oxbridge.

Since leaving HT, Mr Datta has worked closely with the widening participation group at Trinity College, Cambridge to ensure that all students, regardless of class, gender, wealth, ethnicity or choice of school have equal opportunity to attend Oxbridge. Mr Datta ran an assembly for all of Year 9 students discussing what University is like, breaking down stereotypes of Oxbridge students, why University should be an option to you and how important the option process is for your future. Year 9 were really

receptive and engaged in his talk.

35 Year 11 students had a seminar with Mr Datta, where he covered similar content, but delved into A level choices, realistic grades needed at both GCSE and A Level, alongside ways to better your chance of getting an interview; such as reading around areas/subjects you are interested in, listening to podcasts, completing MOOCs and completing

Supercurricular activities that are free to join. "This definitely made me think that this can be an option for me" Year 11 student

A group of 36 Year 9 & 10 students had a similar seminar which was equally well received. Our students asked excellent questions which Mr Datta commented made him realise why he missed teaching at HT. *"This has made me believe that I can follow my dreams and that Cambridge*
