**Reading is a roaring success!** We launched our new reading strategy at the start of this academic year, to support our students with their learning as we returned from the disruption of the past 18 months.

Message from Mr Newman

Being able to read fluently provides our students with the building blocks not just for academic success, but for fulfilling careers and rewarding lives. Since September we have introduced a wide range of reading strategies for our staff to use with students in class, and we have further developed the teaching of specialist vocabulary to support student understanding across the curriculum.

We will continue to regularly test our students, to monitor reading ages over time, and the evidence from this term shows that very many of our students have made real progress with their reading ages in recent weeks.

As well as using our new reading strategies in lessons, students have been reading their class readers with their tutors in tutor time, and our Year 7 students all recently enjoyed our author visit during Anti-Bullying week. Author, MG Vaciago, has written many books, including Big Little Voice - Colours the Grey and Behind the Smile. It was a wonderful event which engaged our students and gave excellent advice to inspire their reading further. We have more plans for later in the academic year!

Mr Datta ran an assembly for all of Year 9 students discussing what university is like, breaking down stereotypes of Oxbridge students, why university should be an option, and how important the options process is for our students. Year 9 were really receptive and engaged in his talk. Mr Datta also ran a seminar for Year 11 students covering A level choices and a seminar for a group of Year 9 and Year 10 students.
