HT Careers Talk with Camelot's Dan O'Connell

Dan O'Connell is the Creative Lead at Camelot / The National Lottery. Dan is one of Haileybury Turnford's Enterprise Advisors and he came in to set a brief for the Year 9 Media project. Dan regularly sets briefs for a team of designers, so this gives our students a real indication into what the real world is like for jobs in the creative sector, such as Media and Design.

Dan spoke to our Year 9s about his career path and gave our students some excellent advice. Dan spoke about how he grew up in the 90s and was deeply passionate about dance and rave music. Dan then spoke about how he began to design his own rave posters to advertise rave nights. Dan began DJing as well as creating posters. Dan didn't have time to mention that he used to coach football at Spurs, whilst doing DJing and creating rave posters. Dan then got a job in the bank, he still was DJing and designing until he earned enough money to stop working at the bank and concentrate on what he loved, designing and being creative.



Dan shared some fascinating stories with us and they kept going back to a message he was given by his Dad when he was younger. 'Do what you love'. I find this statement so powerful and it has been clear that Dan, really has, pursued a career following that mantra.

Dan spoke about work experience he was offered at a design company a few times a month and how that enthused him and open his eyes to a world of designing. This led to Dan being offered a job at Camelot, one of the UK's largest companies, Creative Lead.

Two inspiring statements from assembly; 'be curious' and 'do what you love'.

Ms Ledster and Dan O'Connell are really excited to see what the Year 9 Media students produce.

The sessions have proved to be very popular with over 300 students from across the UK joining in each week. A different medical case each week and our doctors, with the help of the students attending, diagnose and treat the patient in the interactive 2-hour sessions.

Students are able to obtain a certificate every month for their participation in the sessions too.
