

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



'Real Encounters, with Real Employers'



We were lucky enough to hear from Fujitsu's own Tom McMuldroch, an Incident Response & Cyber Threat Analystics for one of the countries biggest tech firms; Fujitsu. Tom spoke through his career path and how he manages Apprentices now and believes if he had to choose his pathway again, rather than the traditional University and Post Graduate Job, he would get an Apprenticeship, as he believes the skills he learnt at University gave him the theory, but not the practical knowledge needed in his current and previous roles. Tom spoke through the skills needed to work within Cyber Crime and the notion that you should always want to learn. Tom explained that Cyber Crime and Response Teams are a growing sector, that doesn't have the skilled workers available, so opportunities will arise if this is something students are interested in. 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HT Careers Talk with Cheshunt FC's Dean Williamson

Dean Williamson is the Chairman of Cheshunt FC, alongside being the Director of LW Developments. Dean is one of Haileybury Turnford's Enterprise Advisors and he came in to speak to Year 8 students in assembly, as well as a selected group of Y10s, 11s, 12s & 13s. Dean is a local lad, who has had an interesting career to date.

Dean did a somewhat traditional route after leaving school. Dean went to University and became a Trader in Canary Wharf and worked at CBRE. Dean's family had owned and worked in Construction, so Dean had always worked on building sites growing up and was familiar with this and decided to get into Development. There was also the opportunity to take over Cheshunt FC.







Dean spoke about the journey and improvements Cheshunt FC has made in the last 10 years and was proud that he had secured the plans to continue the build to a 5,000 seater stadium as well as shops and other community use too.

Dean spoke about the barriers he has faced and that tips that he has developed over the years. Apply yourself, Dean was passionate about this and explained that there is no need to compare the results of your outcomes with others, rather apply yourself fully to all aspects and you will be proud of your achievements. Other top tips involved cooperation, how important it is to get the help from others and never be afraid to ask questions! Never stop learning was another top tip alongside having resilience. Dean spoke about knock backs and failures are inevitable, but dusting yourself down, learning from the knock backs and coming back stronger is so important to be successful. Finally, Dean left us with "Try your best, if you do your best the outcome doesn't matter!" Personally, I find this quote inspiring and something that I hope our students take on board.


