We were delighted to welcome Talent Foundry to HT to work with our Year 8 maths students recently. They are an independent education charity offering a range of opportunities to schools and colleges.

This maths-linked in-school workshop gave our students the opportunity to act as large-scale event organisers in charge of arranging arranging a pop concert for 10,000 young people. Using maths 'by stealth', students analysed the information available to help them make informed decisions. Students were also asked to consider the event's catering and much more. The workshop links maths to real life in a natural way



and presented students with an opportunity to develop their mathematical skills and knowledge in addition to developing their softer skills such as communication, resilience, and teamwork.
