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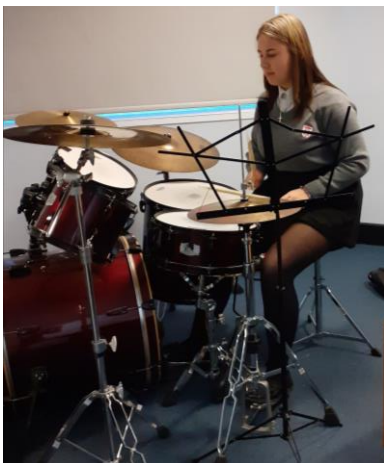

Well done to you all.

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Attendance matters, all day, every day.

Attendance to school is really important to us and we put a lot of time and effort into ensuring that you all attend school on time and as often as possible. Good attendance is essential to attainment at the end of Year 11. Good attendance is defined as having an attendance percentage of 95% or more. A student with an attendance percentage of 90% is likely to achieve 1 grade lower than their predicted grade, whilst a student with an attendance percentage below 80% is likely to perform 2 or 3 grades lower than their predicted grade. **Make sure you are in school every day. If you are not in school, you are not learning.**

hegarty maths

Have you
logged on this
week?

Hegarty maths is a usual tool for consolidating learning in class and a great revision tool. It includes videos and quizzes for the majority of the maths curriculum. **All students should be completing a minimum of 2 x 45 minute sessions a week.** All tasks set by your maths teacher should also be completed.

Logging on: www.hegartymaths.com

To log on, you just need to add your first name, last name and date of birth. If this is the first time visiting the site, you will be prompted to create your own password. If you have forgotten your password, you will have to ask teacher to reset it.

Simple instructions below:

- Click on 'My tasks' in the top right hand corner to view any tasks you have been set. Choose one and click on 'Start task.'
- First watch the video and make notes.
- Then click on 'Do Quiz.' Complete the questions in the quiz.
- If it is correct, you will find out instantly. If you enter an incorrect answer you will have one chance to correct it.
- If it is still incorrect then you will be told the correct answer. You can also message your teacher underneath.
- At the end of the quiz you will get a score. Your teacher will see how long you spent doing the quiz and how much of the video you have watched. Your teacher will also see how many times you have done the quiz, which questions you got right and wrong, which answers you put and the time spent on each one and the date and time of when you did it.

Selecting a task of your choice - If you wish to select a topic of your choice which has not been set by your teacher you can do this by searching in 'Choose Lesson' tab in the top left hand corner.

Or you can enter a topic area in the 'Search Hegarty Maths' bar. This will still record how long you have spent doing quizzes and your teacher will be able to see what you have been doing.
