**Attendance has been great but we can always do better.**

Good attendance is essential to attainment at the end of Year 11. Good attendance is defined as having an attendance percentage of 95% or more. A student with an attendance percentage of 90% is likely to achieve 1 grade lower than their predicted grade whilst a student with an attendance percentage below 80% is likely to perform 2 or 3 grades lower than their predicted grade.

## Year 11 Interventions and revision sessions

Each morning our Year 11 students are expected to arrive by 8.30am to take part in our early morning interventions. Some subjects, including Mathematics, Science and Design Technology, begin their sessions at 8am. Attendance has been excellent with students receiving an additional 2.5 hours each week in tuition on two of their current subjects. These additional intervention opportunities have enabled us to deliver 25 hours of extra content and exam practice to each student since September. In January, and following our first round of GCSE Mock examinations, we will amend our groupings based on current progress. There is a range of additional opportunities for after school intervention and support including a compulsory 3-4pm Mathematics session on a Tuesday and English and History intervention on a Monday.

**Students who take advantage of these additional opportunities will see the greatest success in the Summer 2024 exam series.**

**Maths revision morning sessions take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 8:00am, and 3:00pm on Tuesday.**

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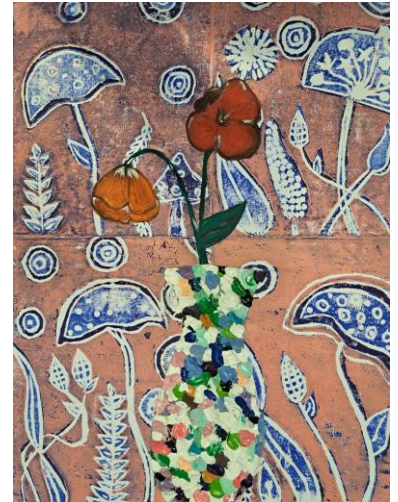
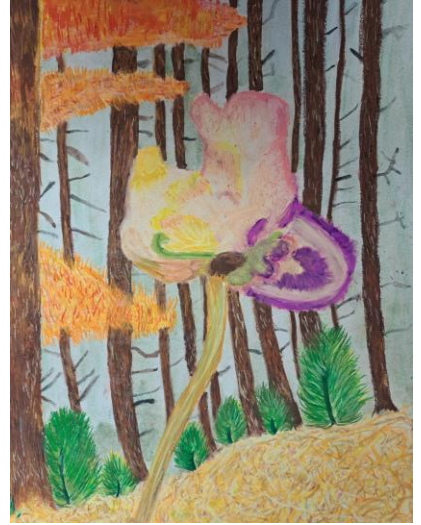
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## GCSE Final Piece Artwork

Here are some examples of work produced in the 10 hours over the two days.





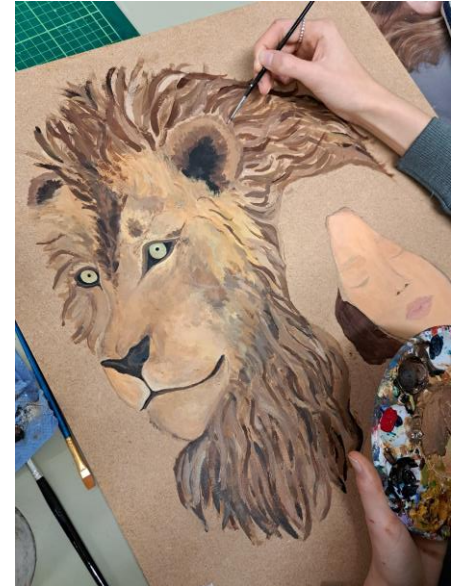
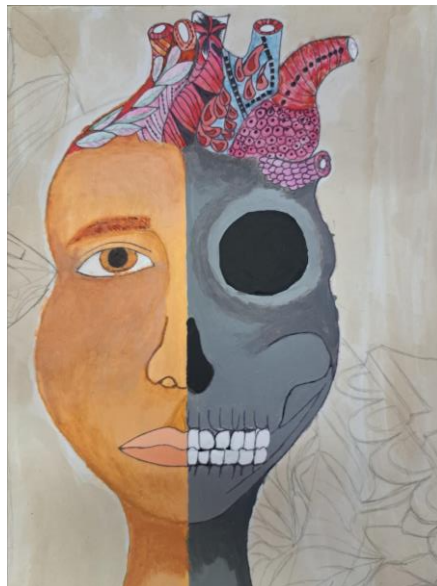
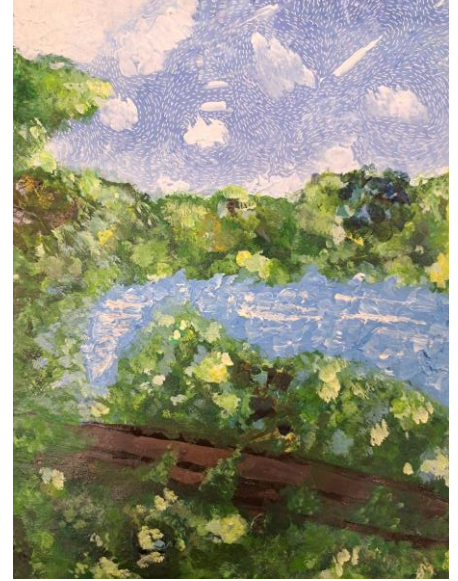
