

Ready for learning: Attendance

Good attendance and punctuality improves chances of success

- Good attendance and punctuality are essential if your child is to achieve their full potential, both academically and socially.
- Students must arrive by 8.35am
- The main school gates will be locked at 8.35am
- If a student arrives after 8.35am they will be marked as being late and will be issued with a late payback (detention)
- The register will be taken at 8.40am

Year 6/7 Transition Day

- Our transition day for all new Year 7 students will be on the 11th July
- Students will need to be at school for 9.00am
- Students should wear their primary school uniform
