

#### What's Been Going On? Careers at Haileybury Turnford

#### **Lovell Construction Careers Workshop (Y10-13)**

Year 10, 11, and Sixth Form engineers took part in a careers workshop led by industry professionals from the Lovell Construction Company. This was a fantastic opportunity for our students to explore career pathways, training opportunities, and job roles within the construction industry. We heard from a former Haileybury Turnford student, currently completing a management apprenticeship at Lovell, who shared his experiences and offered lots of valuable tips and advice on successfully navigating a career in construction. Many of our students have expressed a keen interest in pursuing a career in this field, and the Lovell careers team has kindly offered continued support and guidance as our students plan their next steps.



This workshop tied in nicely with National Apprenticeship (NAW) 2025 looming; highlighting wealth of opportunities apprenticeships offer in a variety of sectors, including construction. The event served as a reminder that apprenticeships are not just for traditional industries, but also for growing fields where hands-on experience is key. We encourage our students to consider apprenticeships as a pathway to gaining qualifications and starting a rewarding career.













#### **University of Hertfordshire Visit (Y12)**

Our Year 12 students recently visited the University of Hertfordshire to learn about UCAS, student finance, and what university life is really like. The visit provided valuable insights to help them with their decision-making process in the months ahead as they begin considering their post-16 options.

#### Benefits of the visit include:

- Gaining a better understanding of the UCAS application process and university entry requirements.
- Learning about student finance options, including loans and grants available to support their education.
- Getting a first-hand look at university life, including student accommodation and campus facilities.
- Hearing from current students about their experiences, offering valuable perspectives on life at university.
- Helping students feel more confident and informed as they start to make decisions about their future education pathways.





#### The Princess Alexandra Hospital Visit (NHS Careers)

A group of our students recently visited the NHS's The Princess Alexandra Hospital in Harlow, where they spent an inspiring afternoon learning about the wide variety of careers within the NHS. This visit gave students a deeper understanding of the opportunities available within healthcare and helped broaden their knowledge of this essential sector. It was a great success for all involved!















#### Bank of England Visit - 11.02.2025 (Pre-Work)

Ahead of our visit to the Bank of England on 11th February, the Bank has kindly loaned Haileybury Turnford a historic treasury box from their vault, containing a range of old banknotes. Students had the unique opportunity to research and inspect these notes, with one favourite being the £10 note featuring Charles Dickens, which was circulated between 1993 and 2003. This activity linked to careers in finance and banking, offering students a fascinating look at the history of currency and its role in the economy.






## THE TWIN-TRACK APPRENTICESHIP TOOLKIT

SUPPORT IN APPLYING FOR AN APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMME ALONGSIDE A DEGREE

LEVEL	APPROXIMATE DURATION	
INTERMEDIATE	12–18 MONTHS	Intermediate level apprenticeships lead to a Level 2 vocational qualification. They provide a basic introduction to a particular occupation or industry and are designed for young people who have achieved fewer GCSE qualifications.
ADVANCED	12-24 MONTHS	Advanced level apprenticeships lead to a Level 3 vocational qualification. They provide more advanced training in a particular occupation or industry and are suitable for young people with five GCSE passes or equivalent.
HIGHER*	3–5 YEARS	Higher apprenticeships lead to a Level 4 or 5 vocational qualification. They are designed to provide higher-level training in a particular occupation or industry and suitable for young people who have achieved a minimum of two A levels or equivalent.
DEGREE*	3-7 YEARS**	Degree apprenticeships lead to a full bachelor's or master's degree. They are ideal for young people who want to work towards a degree while also gaining practical, on-the-job experience. They are suitable for young people who have achieved a minimum of two A levels or equivalent.


