

### Tesco Stronger Starts Apprenticeship

This is one of the few apprenticeship programmes that doesn't require young people to have any qualifications or experience when they start. After completing the programme, they'll gain a Level 2 National Standard in Retail which is the equivalent of 5 GCSE passes.

The apprenticeship is delivered by our partner Lifetime Training and will take a minimum of 12 months to complete. The programme will include a blend of learning activities and hands-on experience on the shop floor. Those joining without a GCSE grade pass or equivalent in maths and English, will gain these during the programme.

- **Balance**: If you're uncertain about your future direction, aim for a broad and balanced selection of subjects. This approach keeps multiple pathways open as you progress in your education.
- **Independence**: Make choices based on your interests and goals, rather than being influenced by friends' decisions or teacher preferences. Your GCSEs are a personal journey tailored to your individual aspirations.







### **Top Tips for Success:**

- Stay Organised: Keep on top of your homework, revision, and coursework. Setting up a revision timetable early on can help manage your workload.
- Seek Help When Needed: If you're struggling with ٠ a subject, ask for help from teachers or attend any support sessions offered. It's important to address difficulties early.
- Focus on Core Subjects: Subjects like English, Maths, and Science are often required for many post-16 options. Make sure you're giving these subjects your full attention.
