What will you do differently and what goals will you set for yourself?

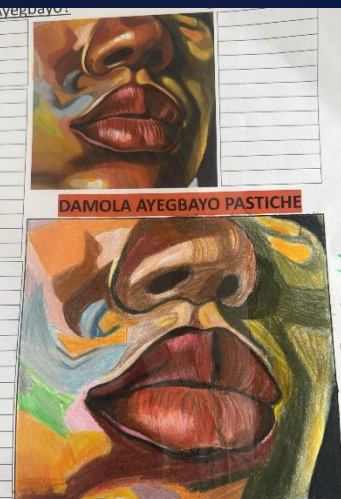
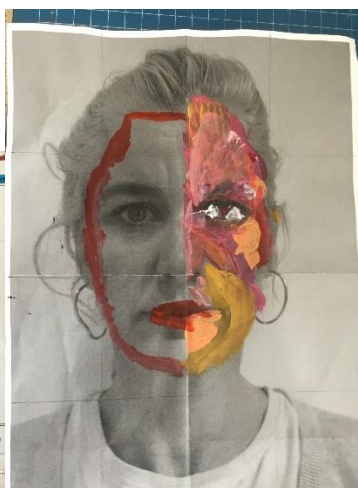
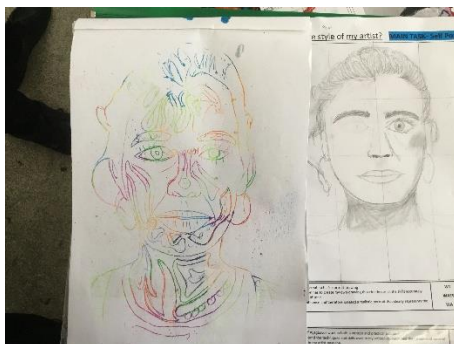
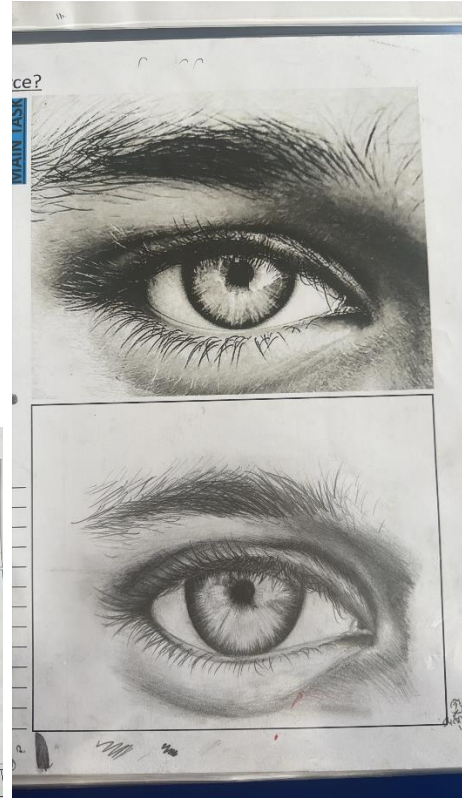
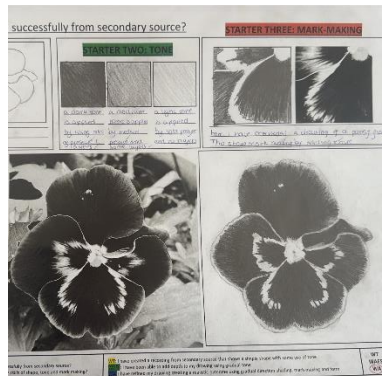
